Facts

After play, West calls the TD and informs him that dummy South has $5 \triangleq$ and $5 \heartsuit$.

Upon review of the system card of NS, 2^{\lozenge} was explained correctly. The 2^{\heartsuit} bid has also been alerted and explained correctly.

East claims that it is possible for N to have a singleton \heartsuit . Therefore he doubled $4\heartsuit$, thinking that it might go down. He claims that if he had known that N has $5 \heartsuit$, he would have bid something (possibly $5\clubsuit$).

Ruling

After checking the convention cards of NS, both the $2\lozenge$ and the $2\heartsuit$ bid were explained correctly. There are no specifications on the convention card regarding the length of the \heartsuit when it comes to bidding $2\heartsuit$.

There is no infraction of the Laws, therefore there is no rectification.

Decision

The score on this board is maintained.

Both teams have the right to appeal to this decision, according to chapter 9 from the national regulations regarding team games.
