## Facts

Screens are in use.
$2 \bullet$ is alerted and explained by West to South as $9+$ HP and no 4 card major; $2 \vee$ is alerted and explained as control Hearts.
2NT is alerted and explained by West as denying control Spade, East does not alert his 2NT. South leads a small Spade, thinking East holds no control in that suit.
First three tricks:
South leads a 3-^5-^9-^J.
East plays $5-3-\mathrm{K}-6$
West plays $2-10-\mathrm{Q}-\mathrm{A}$

South then continues with $\uparrow$. Result: 3NT by East +1 .
South claims the contract would have gone down if he had led a small Club (four $\&$ and $\bullet$ A), which - he said - he would have done if he had received the correct information.

Team B points out that West bid 3NT as he held a stopper in a himself; they doubt whether South would have led \& - in their words the only lead to beat the contract - if he had received the right information on 2 NT : stopper in $\boldsymbol{\uparrow}$ and $\&$.

## Ruling

By giving the wrong information on 2NT West commits an infraction of the law.

For his lead South has the choice between Clubs and Spades; EW's convention card says they lead $4^{\text {th }}$ best against NT. Nevertheless, basing himself on the information he got from West South chooses for Spades as East is thought not to have a stopper in that suit.
After the first trick South should realize that North does not hold $\uparrow \mathrm{K}$ as if he had he would have played it. Continuing $\uparrow$ in the fourth trick therefore is to be considered as not the best line to play. A switch to Clubs would still have beaten the contract.

We can therefore conclude that NS are not disadvantaged as a result of West's infraction (wrong information).

## Decision

The result reached at the table stands.
