


Change of date

 - Not allowed
- Nat I:
 - / Advance : allowed, no restrictions
 - \ Postpone : allowed

to play before the **next** competition day

- Nat II & III :
 - / Advance : allowed, no restrictions
 - \ Postpone : allowed

to play before the **second next** comp day

Special requirements (in accordance to the international regulations)



convention cards

- Honor & Nat I
 - Obligatory (21 d < competition)Changes are applicable only after 7 days.
- Nat II & Nat III
 - = Obligatory (21 d < compettion)</p>
 - Changes or new cards are applicable only after 7 days.
 - In case of force majeure the CD must be contacted immediatly.




In case of:

- Convention card
 - not published in time

Restrictions

Use a convention card of another pair that was uploaded in time

or


- Play a system with the following restrictions :
 - Concerning the bidding system : green bidding system only
 - Concerning the conventions :only the usual conventions used in that division



In case of:

- No convention card
- Fouled boards

ex: a number of boards played in the same direction by both pairs of the team



- $\leq \frac{1}{4}$ of the boards not comparable
 - ⇒ no extra boards to play
- ½ ¼ of the boards not comparable
 - \Rightarrow extra boards to plat untill $\frac{3}{4}$ of the boards are comp.
- > ½ of the boards not comparable
 - ⇒ all boards are canceled, and whole match should be replayed



In case of:

- No convention card
- Fouled boards
- Late start
- Absent team
- Stoppage of the match
- Nuisance or noise
- Force Majeure



The Purpose =

To play the game as much and as often as possible

To play the game as much and as often as possible

This means: whenever there is the possibility and the time to play, the game should be played!

```
/ full match (choice of the non-violating team) \ reduced match
```

 A valid result can be calculated on condition that at least half of the boards can be played (counted at 8 min. per board)

```
ex : Nat II, phonecall after 20 min, arrival 50 min late 50/8=6 \rightarrow 26 boards can be played
```

 If there is a delay of time, the delayed team must contact their opponents within the hour, otherwise they will be considered absent

To play the game as much and as often as possible

If the match cannot be played (completely), the captain of the non-violating team can accept to play or continue the game another day (except for matches on the protected days)

Note: penalty for the violating team (chapter 8)

Attitude:

- On one hand more flexible to play
- On the other hand a more severe attitude towards "force majeure" (see also chapter 9)


- First violation
 - warning
- Second violation
 - 1 VP penalty
- Third violation, etc
 - 2 VP penalty

Violations related to or with possible influence on the game

 \downarrow

- First violation
 - □ 1 VP penalty
- Second violation, etc
 - 3 VP penalty
- Transfer to another date
 - 3 VP penalty

Cassation









A fact can be considered as "force majeure" under the following conditions:

- An unpredictable and unavoidable event,
- No responsibilitys of the player(s) or the team involved
- Insurmountable

making the compliance with the rules impossible

To be receivable:

- ➤ Meet the correct description
- > Follow the correct procedure :



Immediate report to the CD

Sufficiently motivated request (written demand within 24h to the CO)

Appeal and Cassation

For the procedure to follow for appeal and cassation we refer to the committees responsible.
